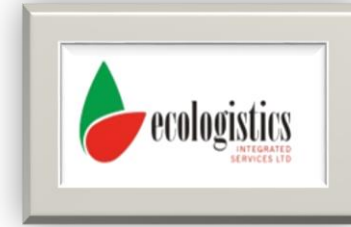





# Reframing IDP Challenges to Opportunities

---

- Checking future crime exacerbation;
- Capacity development among the displaced youths (industrial, sports, etc.);
- Job creation ( for example over 60,000 counselling jobs can be generated);
- Data collection from Uniform Case Reviews (UCR) to assist in policy formulation and decision-making including re-integration plans for the IDPs; and
- Opportunities to access international funding for displaced persons such as the World Bank fund (\$2.1bn) for rebuilding the North East Nigeria.

# Impact of IDPs - Complexities

---

## **Extenuating complexities of unanticipated consequences of IDPs**

- Behavioral dependencies of human exchange relationships
- Perception of exchange distribution justice
- Social comparison processes
- Unanticipated change in recipient behavior

Exacerbation of Slums due to lack of permanency strategy
